That's where I met the families I would form the closest relationships with. Shantae and her family were first. It was a tremendous honor to be a part of what God was doing in the people's lives. I remember feeling a sense of awe and holiness each time someone would pray earnestly to Jesus with me or entrust the aches of their hearts to me for prayer and comfort. I knew I was dealing with the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven and should therefore tread with careful reverence!

These past 17 years have shaped and completely transformed me so deeply, I don't even know who I'd be without Freedom Outreach. I marvel and grieve as I look around me at the kids I used to buckle in car seats who are now fully grown. Some are full of life, maturing into the amazing adults they were created to be.
